 - Many Christians believe Israel is no longer significant in God's plan.
 - Anti-Semitism has morphed into anti-Zionism, denying Israel's right to exist.

- II. Historical Development of Anti-Semitism in the Church
 - Early church's dependence on clergy before the printing press
 - Acknowledgment of early church fathers' contributions
 - However, many also promoted anti-Jewish sentiments:
 - Irenaeus: Jews disinherited from God's grace
 - Tertullian: God rejected Jews in favor of Christians
 - Justin Martyr: Church inherits Jewish promises
 - Origen: Called Jews "Christ-killers"
 - Jerome: Used dehumanizing imagery
 - John Chrysostom: Extreme anti-Semitic rhetoric

III. Influence on Christian Practice and Beliefs

- Anti-Jewish themes in Christian liturgy, especially around Holy Week
 - Martin Luther: Initial support, later violent rhetoric against Jews

IV. Theological Offshoots of Replacement Theology

- Fulfillment Theology:
 - · Jesus fulfilled all Jewish promises; Old Testament seen as obsolete
 - Example parallels: Egypt, wilderness, vine imagery

V. Present-Day Concerns and False Teachings

- Anti-Israel sentiment among some Arab Christian communities
 - Promotion of "Palestinian Jesus"
 - Christ at the Checkpoint conference as an example
- Warning about rewritten theology replacing Israel with Palestine

VI. Final Reflections and Encouragement

- Importance of being informed and discerning
- God's covenant with Israel is everlasting (Genesis)
- God's faithfulness to Israel assures His faithfulness to the Church
- Call to action: share the podcast, seek truth, and be a blessing
